

Quantity surveying involves controlling and managing costs on construction projects. Construction Quantity Surveyor apprentices are supported in developing key knowledge, skills and behaviours to advance their experience and take on lead roles in more complex and exciting projects. Gain a BSc (Hons) whilst working with no tuition fees to pay.

A Construction Quantity Surveyor Degree Apprenticeship is ideal if you want to build on your existing experience or are looking to develop new skills to enhance future career opportunities. Construction Quantity Surveyors play a lead role in managing the cost aspects of complex construction projects, exercising a tight control of the expenditure and income. They're responsible for managing the commercial success of the project for all stakeholders and managing the selection of the specialist contractors. They also need to ensure that a comprehensive study of the whole life aspects of the project has been undertaken and the client's needs are taken into consideration.

Degree apprenticeships are fully funded by employers and the Government. They are also work-based so employees do not have to pay fees to improve their skills, whilst delivering impact in the workplace as they learn. Entry criteria applies.

Delivery & Assessment

At least 20% of your contracted working hours will be classed as 'off-the-job'. This time will be dedicated to developing the knowledge and skills needed to meet the requirements of the apprenticeship, and therefore is not part of your usual work duties. OTJ learning will be delivered through University-led learning sessions and activities, and practical learning experiences in your usual work setting. This Apprenticeship is delivered on a day release basis at the Chelmsford campus (and Peterborough).

Assessment is at the end of each module undertaken (on-programme assessments) which will contribute towards the final award of the qualification. End Point Assessment takes place when all on-programme assessments have been successfully passed. The EPA for this apprenticeship is independently assessed.

Upon successful completion of the apprenticeship, you will have a BSc (Hons) in Quantity Surveying and a minimum of three years' relevant work experience. The skills, knowledge and experience you develop during the course will prepare you for roles such as Quantity Surveyor, Construction Surveyor, Construction Cost Consultant, Cost Engineer, Cost Analyst, Cost Manager, Project Cost Co-ordinator, Project Cost Controller, Cost Planner or Commercial Manager.
