

BSc (Hons) Project Management



Coventry University Apprenticeships are pleased to offer the Project Management degree apprenticeship which equips apprentices with the skills they need to become professional project managers.

Project Management is an increasingly important discipline in today's business world, with projects being the vehicle for implementing strategic initiatives, new product developments and organisational change. Project management is much more than a set of tools and techniques, plans and progress charts. It's about leading change, building meaningful relationships with stakeholders and focusing on the needs of the customer or end user.

The BSc (Hons) Project Management course is an integrated degree apprenticeship delivered over four years. The programme has the flexibility to be contextualised to specific requests to meet individual organisational requirements based on candidate experience, qualifications, background, and business needs.



Cost and funding

If your organisation pays the apprenticeship levy, the cost can be covered by your levy funds. If you are not a levy paying organisation there can be substantial government funding available to you under the co-investment scheme.

Entry requirements

GCSE/Level 2:
Grade C or above in Maths and English
A Levels/Level 3:
Grade BBC
or
BTEC:
Grades DMM

Candidates will be reviewed on a case by case basis. For any that do not meet the above entry criteria, consideration will be taken for relevant work experience.

In addition to gaining a BSc (Hons) in Project Management at the end of the apprenticeship, apprentices take the APM's Project Management Qualification (PMQ) examination at the end of the second year, which is an internationally recognised qualification equivalent to IPMA's Level D: Project Management Associate, a pre-requisite of this apprenticeship's end point assessment..

Apprentices who successfully complete the course are eligible to apply for full membership of the Association for Project Management.
