End Point Assessment takes place when all on-programme assessments have been successfully passed. The EPA for this apprenticeship is independently assessed.

Upon successful completion of the apprenticeship, you will have a BSc (Hons) degree in Construction Management and a minimum of 3 years relevant work experience. The skills, knowledge and experience you develop during the course will prepare you for roles such as Construction Site Manager, Assistant Construction Site Manager, Site Manager, Sub Agent, Assistant Site Manager or Construction Planner.
